Job Summary

LFN Land Guardians will collaborate with Kaska, other Guardians, governments, organizations, and other First Nations to integrate Kaska knowledge, traditions, practices, and beliefs into effective decision-making processes that protect and enhance Kaska Aboriginal rights. This often involves influencing wildlife conservation and management through education and effective communication.

Education and Experience

- Minimum Grade 12 or an equivalent combination of education, training and experience
- Experience in back country travel in northern boreal forest and alpine tundra
- Experience operating pickup truck, ATVs, snowmobile, and motorized watercraft

Knowledge & Skills

- Knowledge of the history, cultures, traditional territory, goals and aspirations of the Kaska people
- Understanding of the goals and objectives of the Lands and Resources Department and of Yukon Renewable Resources Department
- Knowledge of Territorial legislation pertaining to hunting and trapping, including but not limited to the Yukon
- Knowledge of the Yukon and BC Wildlife Acts, of the Agreement of International Humane Trapping Standards (AIHTS), and Yukon trapping regulations
- Knowledge of fisheries and wildlife management principles and practices
- Ability to work as a team member, and skill in networking to gain the cooperation of others
- Well-developed oral and written communication skills
- Ability to demonstrate leadership and to motivate others
- Ability to use good judgement to take initiative and to act independently

Conditions of Employment/Working Conditions

- The Land Guardian will be expected to spend most of their time in the field, extended multi-day remote travel may be required
- The Land Guardian may occasionally be required to deal with upset individuals or groups
- Valid Yukon Class 5 driver's license, provision of recent driver's abstract
- Valid First Aid/CPR Certificate
- Valid Possession and Acquisition License (PAL)
- Pleasure Craft Operator's License (boating license)
- Hunter Education and Ethics Development Course
- Trapper Training Course
